



Getting to Know Each Other Better Interviews with Meredith Anderson

This month I'm continuing to find out about different members. I talked Garry and Judy Bowman about their life and what eventually brought them to the San Diego Swing Dance Club.



Garry James Bowman was born on September 25, 1944 in Detroit, Michigan. Judith Diane Bowman, nee Barringer, was born on June 12, 1944 in Highland Park, Michigan. Garry and Judy attended local public schools. Garry's high school was in Detroit and Judy's high school was in Livonia, Michigan. Garry graduated in January 1962 and started attending the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, Michigan in February 1962. He graduated with a Bachelor in Business Administration in 1965. He attended the University of Michigan Law School from 1965 to 1968 receiving his Juris Doctorate in May 1968. After high school, Judy began working as an administrative assistant with a local law firm. In 1963 she obtained a position as administrative assistant to the quality control manager at the Ford Motor Company parts plant in Ypsilanti, Michigan.



Garry and Judy first met at age 12 when they joined the orchestra at the church they were attending with their families. At the age of 16, they started dating. When Garry went away to col-

lege, they continued to date on weekends when Garry was able to return to Detroit from Ann Arbor. Even though Garry had several years of college and law school ahead, they decided that seeing each other on occasional weekends was not enough for them. In December 1963, Garry proposed marriage. On August 17,1963 they were married at the same church where they had first met.

They moved to Ann Arbor and lived in a married student apartment on campus. In 1967, with Garry's graduation from Law School approaching in May 1968, Garry and Judy began talking about their future after law school. Garry saw that law firm recruiters from over the country were coming to Ann Arbor to interview potential associates. Rather than consider a position with a law firm in the midwest or east coast, Garry and Judy decided that their future should be in southern California. Garry arranged an interview trip to San Diego in mid-November 1967. Leaving dreary, cold Detroit, he arrived in sunny San Diego and was sold on the weather and opportunities available. After the interview trip, Garry was offered a job as Deputy City Attorney with the San Diego City Attorney's office, subject to passing the California State Bar.

Garry and Judy moved to San Diego in May 1968. They have 4 adult children and 7 grandchildren and live in Bonita California.

Garry and Judy love to travel and have been to every corner of the world, including the 7 wonders of the world. They have been (sometimes only briefly) to 93 countries. They have been to every continent. They continue to travel and have plan to see new places in the future.

Garry and Judy never danced at all until the summer of 2015 when Bob and Suzie Avila invited them to their home to learn to dance. They began meeting with other couples approximately every other Saturday afternoon. Bob taught

them the basic moves of West Coast Swing, Cha Cha, Night Club two-step, Country twostep and other dances. After a year, they invited Garry and Judy to attend the dances at the San Diego Swing Dance Club. Garry and Judy continue to dance regularly at the San Diego Swing Dance Club on Sundays and continue to learn to be better dancers. When they travel, especially on cruise ships, they



take every opportunity to dance at the various venues provided. Although they both turn 80 in 2024, they continue to be young at heart and dancing is part of their Healthy lifestyle. They are strong believers that a full life requires faith in God, exercise, eating healthy, service to others, generosity, relationships, fun and, most of all, love.
