John Nagel — Cha Cha — January 5

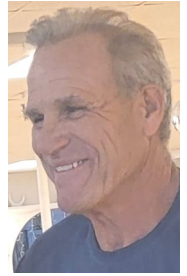

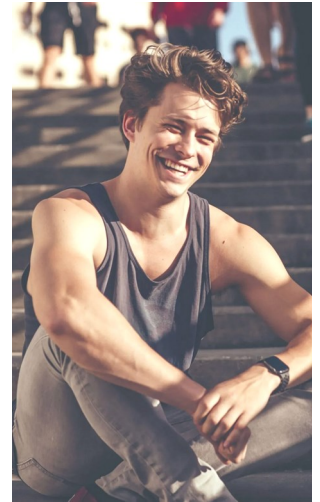

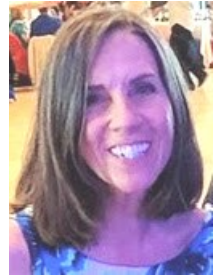

Getting to Know Each Other Better Interviews with Meredith Anderson



This month, my interview is with one of our newer members. You've probably seen Don Kuhli around the club, in Parker's classes, or maybe even at one of his gigs around town!

Please tell us about your history and how you got to San Diego.

My life can be generalized as one of music. I was born in Ann Arbor, Michigan, but did most of my growing up in Illinois.

I spent three years in Berkeley, CA, for high school (man, was that an education). I was always in the school band and even served as drum major for the marching band at Berkeley High School.



Then, it was back to Illinois for my senior year of high school. I thought I'd like to become a public school band director one day. I went to college at Northern Michigan University in Marquette, MI (look it up on a map—it's right on Lake Superior). It's gorgeous up there.

I dropped out of college to play rock and roll and moved to Ann Arbor by coincidence—no family ties. I lived and played music there for over 20 years.

My family eventually recruited me to move to San Diego to help my father in his golden years.

I went back to college at SDSU, earned a BA in music education, and got a teaching credential. I taught music at Clairemont High School until retiring in 2017. I'm proud to say I realized my childhood dream.

All this time, I was still playing drums in various groups and ensembles. Lately, I've moved into musical theater, playing drums in orchestra pits. I think I'm up to about 20 different musicals over the years.

What got you into the world of social dance?

When I wasn't playing somewhere myself, I liked to go

out and support fellow musicians by attending their events.

And there I would sit—watching couples dance—feeling like a wallflower.



It was at one of Mercedes Moore's gigs that she told me she teaches beginning East Coast Swing. I attended her classes for about three months and loved it.



Then I saw a notification on Facebook for San Diego West Coast Swing on Sundays. It turned out to be the San Diego Swing Dance Club.

I'm hooked. I love it, and it's really good for me.

I get to meet people, stay active, and learn something new. Win, win, win.
