David Walkup and Trish Connery Walkup are trained dancers, teachers, choreographers, competitors, and judges specializing in partner dances. They are based in San Diego.

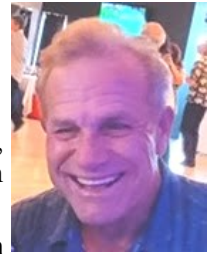

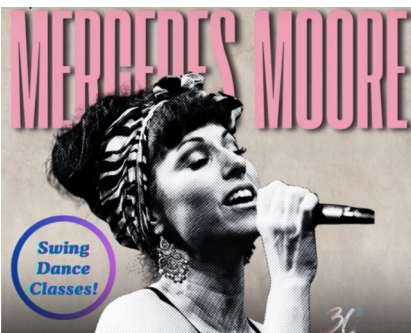
### June 22 — Parker Dearborn Advanced WCS Workshop

## Getting to Know Each Other Better — Interviews with Meredith Anderson

**This month I had the pleasure of interviewing Larry Grogan, a.k.a Larry #3**

I was born on February 1, 1942, in Miller, South Dakota. Two months later, my father reported for duty in the Army. He participated in Operation Torch, the Allied landing at Oran, Algiers, in November 1942.

In 1943, my mother's family moved to Portland, Oregon, to work in the war industry. My mother was encouraged to join them, and she became a certified welder in the shipyards.

After the war, we moved back to South Dakota. During seventh and eighth grade, I attended a one-room country schoolhouse. My father leased a farm, and we milked 26 cows twice a day—by hand. That convinced me that farm life wasn't for me.

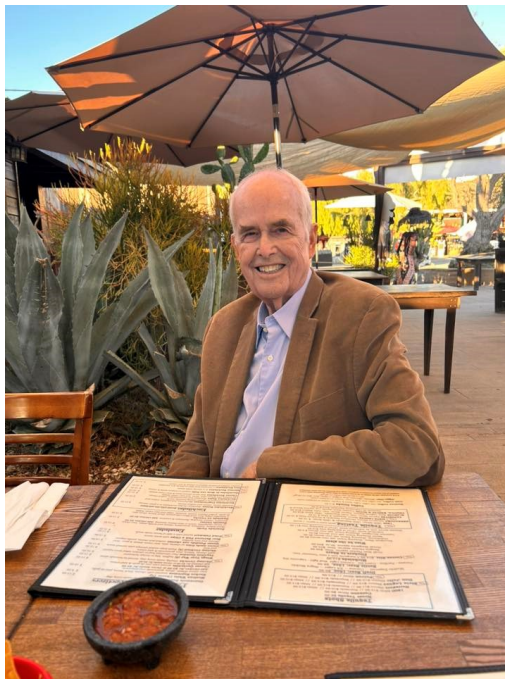
With the help of family, I moved to Chula Vista, where I finished high school on June 16. By June 19, I was standing on the famous "yellow footprints" at MCRD.

I loved the Marine Corps and was fortunate to be on the first plane of Marines deployed to Cuba during the Cuban Missile Crisis. Unfortunately, a knee injury ended my military career.

As a civilian, I worked as a manager for a finance company. I eventually married and had two children—a boy and a girl. I now have two fine grandsons.

Later, I left the finance company to work for SDG&E, where I was responsible for all geothermal exploration, both onshore and offshore. This included drilling and testing operations in the Salton Sea geothermal resource, as well as planning and directing geothermal drilling on Lihir Island in Papua New Guinea. (Kennecott, the company involved, was part of British Petroleum at the time.)

In addition to my professional work, I served the El Centro and Imperial Valley commu-



nities, spending four years on the El Centro City Council, including a term as mayor in 2001. I also served on the Imperial County Board of Supervisors and was Chairman of the Board in 2007.

My wife and I opened a pawnshop in El Centro, which we ran for 22 years before selling it in 2012 and relocating full-time to Alpine. I developed a passion for woodworking, which I've enjoyed for the past ten years.

Sadly, my wife passed away from cancer in 2017. In 2019, I began taking guitar and dance lessons at the El Cajon Adult Center. Eventually, I joined the San Diego Swing Dance Club at the Elks Hall in El Cajon, where I remain a member.

That same year, I met Chris Leavy. We share many common interests—music, dance, theater, and travel. Together, we've traveled extensively, including visits to Ireland, river cruises in France, the Old Globe Theatre tour in London and Bath, and several shorter trips within the United States.

Although I'm retired, I remain involved in the energy industry—specifically with a lithium project in Imperial County. It's a \$2 billion effort slated for groundbreaking this summer or fall. The project will also produce manganese and zinc at full development. I acquired the mineral rights and land to build the John Featherstone Power Plant, which will provide brine for the lithium plant.

There have been many attempts at mineral development in the Imperial Valley. After seven years of research, testing, and reporting, I have high hopes that direct lithium extraction will finally succeed.
